Dear Parent/Guardian of an Incoming 7th grade PreAP English student,

We are so excited that your student will be joining the Bailey family in August! We know that your elementary campus has prepared your student well for the next phase of their educational career...JUNIOR HIGH!

Your student indicated interest in enrollment in PreAP 7th grade English on their course request sheet turned into our counselors here at Bailey. This placement means that your student will not have double blocked reading and writing classes daily but will attend a single blocked English class that will incorporate reading and writing in a 48 minute class period each day.

One of the expectations of all 7th grade PreAP English students is to complete the summer reading assignment. This year, students will be expected to read *A Wrinkle In Time* and complete chapter questions prior to returning to school in August. Here are some things you need to know:

- There are QR codes/URLs for online completion as well as a hard copy version. Your student will need to log in using their AISD student Google account information. **SEE BACK OF LETTER FOR LOGIN INSTRUCTIONS.** *Note: last summer the passwords changed half-way through...don't panic if this happens! Have your student complete the questions on the hard copy and bring with them the first week of school. The 7th grade English teachers will provide time and login support for your student to be able to transfer answers to the online version.
- You may purchase a copy of *A Wrinkle in Time* in the following ways: digitally (Kindle/Amazon/etc), Barnes & Noble bookstores, or Half Priced Books. If you need a copy of the book, you may come to Bailey and check one out for the summer. *Note: There is no one in the building in July, so please try to take care of this in June or wait until the first part of August.
- Students will be expected to complete the chapter questions and reading by the first day of school, Monday, August 20th.
- Students can access the summer reading assignment online through the Bailey website.
- While the book has recently been adapted into a movie, we strongly encourage students to not solely rely on it to answer the chapter questions. **Students get only 1 chance to complete the chapter questions.**

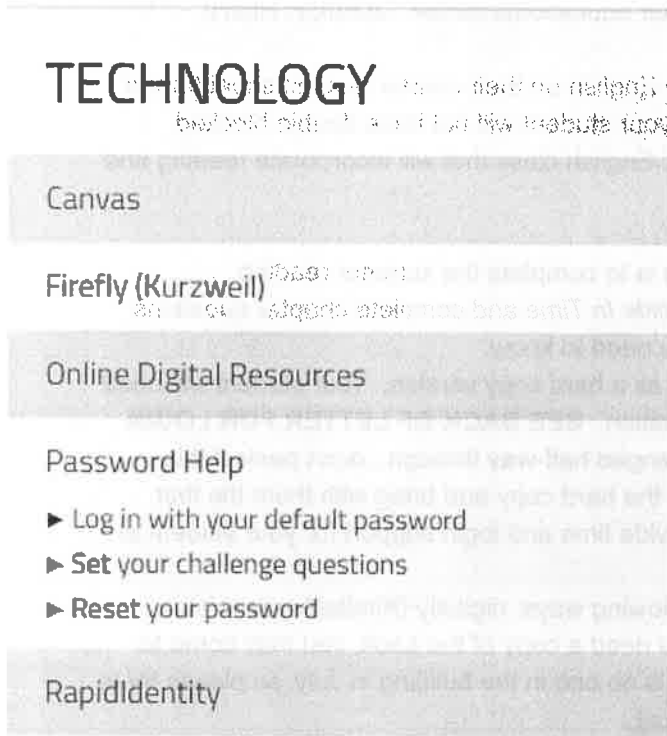

Instructions for Accessing Chapter Questions ONLINE:

1. Open a web browser (preferably Chrome) and go to www.aisd.net
2. Click on STUDENTS
3. Scroll down until you see TECHNOLOGY and select RapidIdentity.



4. Username should be first FIVE letters of LAST NAME and LUNCH #. Password is whatever student has set up. *There should be security questions set to help get logged in if password is forgotten. Otherwise, select PASSWORD HELP and RESET PASSWORD on AISD-->STUDENT-->TECHNOLOGY screen.
5. To access the chapter questions EITHER:
 - a. Copy and paste the URL into a web browser. (Do not click on the link or try to type it)
 - b. Scan the QR codes provided. *Inigma is good QR code reader...and it's a FREE app.
6. Complete questions online as you read each chapter.
